<u>Informational Presentations</u>

YOUTH SERVICE LEARNING

Students are required to have 36 Youth Service Learning hours in order to graduate. These hours can start the day they graduate from 8th grade. They are due in April of their graduation year.

- Hours must be logged in <u>PATHWAYos</u>.
- First semester graduates have a December 1st due date and end of year graduates have an April 15th due date. Hours must be approved prior to these due dates within the PATHWAYos website.
- 9 hours of service learning must be completed each year to be eligible for Youth Apprenticeship, Work Release, and/or Commons eligibility. (Freshmen 9, Sophomore 18, Junior 27, Senior 36). Hours must be complete by January 15th for 2nd semester privilege.
- Service Hours should be community-based outside of family commitments. Service Hours may not be approved by a family member or a current HHS Student.

PSAT (PRELIMINARY SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST)

ACT PREP CLASS

Hortonville High School will once again be a host site for an ACT Prep class. The class is geared toward all Juniors to help prepare them for the ACT test on March 11. The four-day course includes: two days of direct instruction, one full-length practice exam with scoring, and one final day dedicated to additional review of materials and practice examples. The class will be held Monday, February 24 through Thursday, February 27, 2025, from 4:15-7:15 p.m. The cost of the class is \$130 or with a writing sample \$160. There is limited seating available, and spots are filled on a first come first serve basis. There are other class sites available if these dates at Hortonville do not work for you. HHS Behavioral Expectations and Examples

HHS Phone Expectations

All phones will be located and silenced in a centralized location for the duration of the class period. Examples: Phone Holders, Phone Bin or other teacher selected locations.

- Phones will remain in the classroom when students leave class during the class period.
- Computer labs and carts are readily available as needed for technology needs.
- Phones will be allowed during lunch and between classes.

Student Handbook Expectation on Electronic Devices

Cell phones and personal devices (iPods, iPads, Tablets, Smart Phones) may be used before and after school and between classes. Devices may be used during class for student learning purposes with teacher permission. Personal electronic devices should not be used during learning time for entertainment purposes. Attendance Information 2024-2025

Attendance matters! - Please help your student by supporting them in daily attendance here at school. If your child is healthy, please support them in getting to school each school day. Every day of school is an important opportunity for students to learn as well as connect to peers and their teachers.

HASD allows a maximum of 10 excused absences (all or part of a day) in a school year before requiring a doctor's excuse. Beginning with the 11th absence, a doctor's note will be required in order for the absence to be excused. Absences beyond that, without the medical excuse, will be marked unexcused which could potentially lead to a Truancy referral and citation.

We realize some absences are for health or other reasons. Excused and unexcused absences both mean *missing* classroom learning time. Absences can add up. Missing just two days every month puts students at risk of falling behind. Attending school has a huge impact on student success.

If your family or your child needs support, please reach out to us for assistance. We have many resources we can connect you to and are happy to help. If your student regularly misses school, we would like to partner with you to improve their attendance so we can keep them engaged and learning.

Attendance Tips:

- Make sure your students keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Turn off all electronics including TVs, phones, and tablets at bedtime.
- Check with our school nurse or office staff if you are not sure about when to keep your child at home due to illness.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or appointments when school is in session. If your child attends a medical appointment, please ask for a proof of appointment slip upon exit and return that to the school office upon return from the appointment.
- Talk to teachers and counselors for advice if your student feel anxious about going to school.
- Develop a back-up plan for getting your child to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your student to school.

Tardies – A tardy will be documented anytime a student is late 15 minutes or less to class (except for ELT). More than 15 minutes late to class is considered an unexcused absence. Students who are consistently tardy to class will receive a lunch (or after school detention) for every 3 tardies.
