In April of 2016 Wisconsin became the latest state in the country to require CPR training in its schools under legislation signed into law. The legislation requires all Wisconsin public, charter and private schools to teach CPR, as well as cardio cerebral resuscitation, or CCR, as part of health education classes offered to students between 7th and 12th grade. The law took effect in the 2017-2018 school year.

The Hortonville Area School District was very proactive in implementing these changes and sent its health educators to trainings that enabled them to become certified RED CROSS CPR/AED/First Aid Instructors.

What does this mean?
